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50 years ago, Dick Tayler from Winchester South Canterbury, Ariki Club's favourite son trained by the legendary Arthur Lydiard, stunned the athletic world when he seemingly came from nowhere to defeat the world champion David Bedford in the 10,000m, the opening track event of the 1974 Christchurch Commonwealth games. The American Track and Field magazine described this race as one of the top 25 races of all time, and on that day Dick Tayler set a NZ 10K record of 27:46 that still stands as a NZ resident record today.

Athletics Otago are thrilled that Athletics NZ have awarded them the hosting of the national 10,000m champs on the 13th January 2024 as a fitting tribute to the 50th anniversary of Dick's epic victory.

To attract the highest quality field of distance athletes seen in New Zealand for years, accommodation and a limited contribution to airfares is being offered on a first come/first served basis to elite Australian and New Zealand athletes.

Generous prize money is also being offered. Prize money for the Senior Men and Senior Women NZ 10,000m races, with the Junior Men (running with the Senior Men) being eligible should they feature in the first 5 confirmed placegetters.

1st: \$750 • 2nd: \$500 • 3rd: \$400 • 4th: \$250 • 5th: \$100

In addition, \$1,000 will be put up for the first NZ male/female athlete to break their respective NZ 10,000m resident records (27.46.4, Dick Tayler) (32.00.17, Anne Audain).

The evening will comprise 4 races from 7.00-9.15pm as follows:

7.00pm: Open 10,000m/Relay combo (sponsored by Tansley Electrical)

This is intended purely as a fun community event, no electronic timing with lap counting being the sole responsibility of the individual or team. Timing will be by Webscorer, with the mat at the start/finish line, where any/all changeovers are to take place.

Those running the full 10,000m on their own, will have priority over the inside lane, with 50 min being the cutoff in terms of estimated time/ability of all individuals or teams entered due to time constraints. Relay teams can comprise a maximum of 5 team members (not restricted by club, age or gender), with any combination of distances. A team of 5 could run a lap each, in any order, 5 times, and see how close they get to Dick's 1974 time of 27.45!
