PRELIMINARY INFORMATION PACK & "B-SECTION RULES"



The Location

The Australian Underwater Federation Queensland and Mackay Down Under Skin Divers Club would like to invite all interested divers to compete in the Queensland Spearfishing Championships to be held in Bowen, Queensland 3-5 July 2025.

Bowen is located on the north-east coast in <u>North Queensland</u>, at exactly twenty degrees south of the <u>equator</u>. Bowen is halfway between <u>Townsville</u> and <u>Mackay</u>, and 1,130 kilometres (700 mi) by road from <u>Brisbane</u>. Bowen sits on a square peninsula, with the <u>Coral Sea</u> to the north, east, and south. To the south-east is <u>Port</u> <u>Denison</u> and <u>Edgecumbe Bay</u>. On the western side, where the peninsula connects with the mainland, the <u>Don</u> <u>River's</u> alluvial plain provides fertile soil that supports a prosperous farming industry.

Bowen is known for its access to the Great Barrier Reef and is the most northern part of the Whitsunday area.

Call for Boats

The Mackay Down Under Skin Diving Club has limited boats within the Club to conduct the event. As such, if you have a boat available, please let us know as soon as possible to assist with planning.

Warning: Offshore capable medium to larger boats will be necessary due to distances needed to travel to some locations (in excess of 30 nautical miles). There can be severe chop at times.

Registration and Fees

We will be trying to keep registration fees to an absolute minimum. \$50.00 per person per day will be provided to their respective boat owners for travel to and from the competition sites. Vessels with higher fuel costs will need to be discussed the Commissioner and Competitors on board. Registration and Presentation dinners will be at competitor's own expense. This entry fee is based on 15 pairs registering for the competition.

Registrations will open on the 2nd April 2025. To facilitate organization of the event, in particular boat places, there will be a cut-off for registrations of 31st May 2025. Please note, that while the organisers will make all reasonable attempts to provide competitors without boat places a spot this cannot be guaranteed. No late registrations will be considered. Competitor shirt orders will cease on the 13th May 2025. These will be pre-order only but can be ordered additional to registration.

<u>Pairs Format</u>

In keeping with the AUFs motto of 'SAFE SUSTAINABLE SELECTIVE SPEARFISHING' the Queensland Spearfishing Championships are conducted as a True-Pair event. This aligns with current 'best practice' pairs competitions being held in places like Western Australia and New Zealand, along with the Inter-Pacific.

Scoring of the Open Spearfishing Championship will be based on one species per True-Pair per day of competition. You will see from the scoresheet there is a wide variety of eligible species available to competitors.



General Information

The ocean conditions in Bowen will "dictate the terms" as far as where and when we dive.

The Queensland Spearfishing Championships will be conducted of three (3) days, with events prioritised as follows:

Day 1 | Priority 1 – Open Spearfishing Championship (Heat 1):

- Competition must be between 4 to 6 hours duration;
- Ladies and Juniors (aged 15-17) can compete in the Open Spearfishing Championship but do so as ordinary Competitors;
- Juniors must swim in a True Pair with an adult;
- Sub-Juniors (aged 14 and under) cannot compete in the Open Spearfishing Championship

Day 2 | Priority 2 – Other Competitions - dedicated events held for Sub-Juniors, Juniors, Ladies & Film Fishing which can be held simultaneously:

- Competition must be between 4 to 6 hours duration;
- Sub-Junior / Junior / Ladies events to be based on Personal Points and swum in True Pairs format with an adult observer;
- Film-fishing event swum in True Pairs.

Day 3 | Priority 3 – Open Spearfishing Championship (Heat 2).

- Competition to follow format of Day 1.

For the Queensland Spearfishing Championships to be valid, a minimum of one heat of the Open Spearfishing Championship must be held.

All Competitors must be financial members of the AUF or the relevant sporting body in their respective country.

NOTE: Fisheries Officers are red hot around this region. Make sure you are aware of the strict rules relating to all aspects of fishing.

Given the competition will be held in the Great Barrier Reef Marine Park, competitors should be aware the various combined Queensland Fisheries possession limits:

CORAL REEF FIN FISH (see <u>blue section</u> of the scoresheet) - Combined possession limit of 20 in total COD - Combined possession limit of 5 in total CORAL TROUT - Combined possession limit of 7 in total WRASSE - Combined possession limit of 6 Tuskfish*

Score Sheet and System

The standard Australian Underwater Federation scoring system will be used, namely 100 points per species plus 10 points per kilogram for eligible species with a maximum weight for each species of 15kg.

True Pairs Points will be used to determine the Open Spearfishing Championship categories and based on one of each eligible species being weighed-in per True Pair, per day of competition;

Personal Points will be used to determine Other Competition spearfishing categories and based on one of each eligible species to be weighed-in per Competitor.

Sub-Junior will have the minimum weight reduced to 500g or minimum legal length, whichever is greater. No unlisted species will be eligible; only those on the score sheet are eligible (see Official Spearfishing Scoresheet attached).

Any competitor, pair or team who infringes fisheries or marine park limits or regulations will be disqualified from all competitions. All fish shall remain the property and responsibility of the competitor.

<u>Penalties</u>

A 100-point penalty will apply in each instance any Competitor's fish presented for weighing is: an ineligible species; under minimum weight; or in excess of the allowable number for that species.

Any Competitor, Pair or Team who infringes fisheries or marine park limits or regulations will be disqualified from all competitions.

Any Competitor or pair outside the competition area will be disqualified for that day.

Any Competitor, Pair or Team who starts before the start signal will be disqualified for that day.

Competitors who reach the designated sign off point less than 5 minutes late are penalised 100 points. Those between 5 and 10 minutes late are penalised 200 points. Those who are later than 10 minutes are disqualified.



Official Spearfishing Scoresheet

<u>Scoresheet Notes:</u> Only those species shown on this scoresheet are eligible.

No unlisted fish. Only one of each listed species to be weighed-in per True-Pair per day.

<u>All fish</u> weighed-in must be a MINIMUM of 1kg – this applies to all eligible species. Lengths in round brackets refers to minimum *legal* size (note sub-junior 500g or minimum legal length, whichever is greater).

PARROT FISH - All parrot species must be gutted prior to weigh in. Maximum of any 3 listed parrot species per True-Pair per day.

MARLIN – only one marlin species allowed per True-Pair per day

Please note – Competitors should be aware of the Queensland Fisheries combined possession limits:

CORAL REEF FIN FISH (blue section of the scoresheet) - Combined possession limit of 20 in total

COD - Combined possession limit of 5 in total

CORAL TROUT - Combined possession limit of 7 in total

WRASSE - Combined possession limit of 6 Tuskfish*

Guidelines for True-Pairs

- AUF True-Pairs events closely follow the rules set down for the Inter-Pacific events.
- True-Pairs are to use the same safety equipment as previously for and individual event (Compliant Float | Whistle and signalling mirror | Orange plastic safety sheet | Sheathed diver's knife | Weight belt fitted with quick release buckle | cover to spear points | see the "A-Section Rules").
- Two divers of similar capability team up and nominate to compete together as a True-Pair.
- The divers may have one gun each and spare guns unloaded and stored horizontally on a Compliant Float.
- Both divers must practice **'one up-one down'**. This means:
 - watching your buddy dive down, and return safely to the surface;
 - o make eye contact after a dive a blackout can occur up to 15 seconds after ascent; and
 - if you are diving with someone not as adept as you are, stay within their comfortable limits, not yours.
- The True-Pair tows one Compliant Float with the following set up:
 - two rig-lines are attached to the float; one is 4 metres long and the other is a maximum of 30 metres long;
 - Either rig-line may be bungee or part bungee;
 - One diver attaches the long line to his gun or person and is allowed to dive and spearfish;
 - The other diver holds onto the short line, remains on the surface and tows the float;
 - Divers alternate between the short and long rig lines between dives;
 - Both divers must always remain within 30 metres of the float whilst on the surface.
- Whilst the spearing diver is submerged the surface diver must always do his best to stay above the submerged diver and be aware of their position at all times.
- Both divers are not allowed to be submerged below the surface at the same time. Penalty is disqualification.
- The two divers can swap duties of spearing or towing to suit themselves.
- The diver on the surface must not dive, let go of the rig-line or endanger the submerged diver in any way.
- It's not mandatory, but recommended, that the Compliant Float also be equipped with a coiled 50mtr light line and small drop weight in case the surface diver feels the need to immediately search and possibly dive to locate the submerged diver. If deployed, it would anchor the float in the proximity of the potential search area as a reference point.
- The True-Pair are only allowed to weigh-in one of each species on the scoresheet per day of competition. Exceptions apply for Women's and Junior Nominated Pairs.
- It's also recommended that the pair work in depths and conditions where, either one could rescue the other in an emergency situation.
- These guidelines also apply when training / scouting for an event. Scuba, Hooker or similar may not be used when scouting.
- Dive well within your limits. Don't push yourself. Never risk your life or that of another for the sake of a fish.



Safety Notice to Competitors

In the interest of a safe and incident free competition we all need to take responsibility. The organisers have taken reasonable measures to ensure this is possible.

Please ensure you fulfill your responsibility to take care of your own and fellow competitors' safety.

Here is relevant information on safety during the event and some tips to help each competitor remember their role in helping make this happen.

- Each safety boat has a first aid kit with the operator on board. The Primary Safety Boat will be equipped with defibrillator and oxygen resus.
- Each safety boat is equipped with communication to the other safety boat, as well as shore base, and emergency services.
- A competitor may only approach, touch or hold onto a safety boat under instruction from the crew.
- Each safety boat has emergency water on board; however, this is only for emergency use. Competitors
 are strongly encouraged to carry sufficient water on their personal float for hydration as assistance from
 a safety boat for any reason (except for emergency / safety at the discretion of the safety boat operator)
 will result in disqualification from the days event.
- A competitor may enter a safety boat or seek assistance from a safety boat at any time but doing so, for any reason (except for emergency / safety reasons sanctioned at the discretion of the safety boat operator) disqualifies that competitor, and their pair, from that day's competition. Where sanctioned assistance is given divers cannot gain any advantage from assistance from a safety boat over other competitors.
- If you suffer a cut, ensure you stop the bleeding and seek assistance if necessary.
- Full length wetsuits and/or Lycra suits with hoods are recommended due to risk from: stinging jellyfish, cuts and abrasions from coral and sun exposure.
- It is recommended that competitors take some sort of protective footwear (i.e. crocs / reef walkers) just in case they need to walk over the reef.
- Divers are strongly encouraged to wait until they have swum clear of other divers before loading their speargun.
- Ensure you have the safety equipment as set out in the "A Section Rules" as a minimum.
- Use a float capable of carrying your fish out of the water or enclosed.
- If a competitor's flag is laying in the water during the competition the safety boat crews will ask the competitor to right it. The flag must be upright and visible as much as possible allowing for weather conditions. Floats and dive flags must be clearly visible to boat traffic at all times, to ensure the safety of the diver.
- If the flag continues to lie down in the water and not remain upright, safety boat crew are permitted to examine the float setup to check for problems and record the diver number, it will then be reported to the Championship Director. Divers must co- operate with safety boat instructions at all times.
- One of the biggest risks to a competitor in the water is collision with a craft / boat.
- The more visible you are the less likely this is to happen. Put your head up often and look about for boat traffic. If surfacing and hearing a boat raise your gun above your head as you ascend.



- The safety boats will aim to redirect/inform approaching watercraft of the large number of divers present whenever possible.
- Ocean currents create a risk of being swept out to sea, it can happen and has happened in high level competition so please be vigilant. Always be aware and stop, look, and monitor what the current is doing.
- If you become aware of a strong rip or dangerous current, please notify the safety boat crew so they may warn other competitors.
- In case of exceptionally high risk (for example a large predatory shark or dangerous weather change) the safety boat crews have the authority to remove competitors from the water. In this case the competition will cease for the day and no results will be recorded.
- If you see a large predatory shark, it is suggested you remain composed with slow deliberate movements to keep your eyes and speargun directed towards the animal as long as possible whilst you move away from any fish you may have and towards shore, another diver or nearby boat to back you up. If necessary, jab the shark hard around the head / eye / gills area and continue to fend off and watch until you feel the animal is gone. Remain watchful and move quietly to safety and ensure the safety boat is advised. Depending on the animal's behaviour and movement within the area the safety boat has the authority to remove all persons to shore or safety and cancel the event.
- Other ocean life that may cause discomfort to divers is jellyfish. Should any diver sustain stings that cause swelling to throat or mouth area that may impede breathing or if you have an allergy, seek assistance from the safety boats immediately.
- To draw attention from one of the safety boats you may:
 - Raise your gun in the air if it is <u>not</u> an urgent situation
 - In an urgent situation
 - Wave your gun in the air, covered with an orange plastic safety sheet
 - Blow your whistle and use your signalling mirror
- Rocks close to the shoreline / reef can be covered in weed which is extremely slippery and coral which is sharp.
- Care must be taken when exiting the water onto rocks/ coral.
- Whenever a competitor is out of the water, tips of guns must be covered, or spearhead removed.
- Aim to eat healthily and avoid excessive alcohol consumption during the week of competition.
 Energy levels and hydration are key elements to personal performance and safety during such physically demanding competitions.
- Wherever possible try to remain in sight of another person or float so you may attract attention for assistance. Raise your head often and think about the movements and safety of yourself and other competitors.
- Lastly, please remember that all committee members and helpers are volunteers.
- Organisation and planning for this competition has taken the majority of the past year. Please treat all volunteers, helpers and organisers with respect. Constructive comments are welcome, however inappropriate or abusive language/attitude is not.
- Competitors should familiarize themselves with the Spearsafe website.




General Location Map








Boat Ramp Location









